




### **ACCESSIBILITY**

HOTA – For wheelchair users and people with mobility requirements, there is a ramp that provides access from the street level to the terrace and HOTA Café, and then heading indoors there is a lift which will take you to the main foyer, Box Office and Theatre 1.

Guide Dogs and Assistance/Service Animals - your guide dog or registered assistance/service animal is more than welcome. Just let HOTA know you'll be bringing one when you book your tickets.

Theatre 1 Stage accessibility - whilst there are some challenges that HOTA face due to the age of the venue (ie access via BOH areas), HOTA staff are able to offer access for a range of requirements.

BROADBEACH CULTURAL PRECINCT - Access to Albert Water Ways Auditorium is via the front entrance of the building with no stairs. For access on stage there is a wheelchair lift or ramps at rear of building.

ROBINA COMMUNITY CENTRE - Access to Robina Community Centre Auditorium is via the front entrance of the building with no stairs. For access on stage there is a wheelchair lift.

Access to the multipurpose rooms has a ramp and all rooms we use are on the ground floor. Additional warm up room on the first level, access via the lift.

### A.B. PATERSON - DAWN LANG PERFORMING ARTS CENTRE -

There is a ramp to provide access from the street level to the theatre entrance. Access into the theatre is from the entrance doors either side of the building, all the same floor level with space available for wheelchairs and mobility aids in the centre row.

GLOW - Is a one level venue and seating in the auditorium is all one level. There is a ramp to access the stage from the auditorium.

TSS - Entry to the theatre from the street is all one level, seating available on the same level. Access to the stage is all via one level.

**ALL GROUPS - DANCE, BANDS & CHORAL -** Must have two delegated marshals for each group who will assist in the flow of the competition and supervise entering and exiting their performance.

We will require numbers in group when entering.

ALL Groups – there will be no access to 'holding' room for parents. This area is limited to performers, teachers and delegated marshals. Bags are to be kept to a minimum.

Only hand held props i.e. the dancer must be able to carry the prop in their hands (chairs / benches will be allowed)

### **ADMINISTRATION FEE**

\$10 administration fee is charged and is non-refundable for each invoice/entry - this fee includes the electronic program emailed when completed mid-June.

Competitors aged 16 to 20 years as at January 1, 2025 are invited to apply for the Artistic Development Grants if they have won either two solo sections or one championship section in their chosen genre.

Entrants are to complete a written application after which one performer from each of the following will be chosen to receive a \$500 grant:

Dance | Vocal | Strings | Wind/Brass | Piano | Speech & Drama

Each winner must then submit an electronic performance to the Gold Coast Eisteddfod to then be submitted to a panel of judges to decide a winner who will receive a further \$1,000 and a runner up a further \$500.

### **Terms & Conditions**

### 1. Definitions:

- a) Eisteddfod means the annual performing arts competition organised by the GCE.
- b) Entrant means any performer who is entered in the Eisteddfod.
- c) GCE is the organisation which is responsible for organizing and providing the Eisteddfod.
- d) Syllabus means that the Syllabus published by the GCE on the GCE website for relevant Eisteddfod year.

### 2. Entry:

- a) Entrants to the Eisteddfod must be amateur performers (not professional performers) unless otherwise stated in Syllabus.
- b) Entries must be received by the GCE by the entry close date advertised in the Syllabus online on GCE website. Late entries will not be accepted by GCE.
- c) Entries must be submitted through the online entry system on the GCE website.
- d) Entries are not transferable from one person to another where individual performers are named.
- e) The GCE reserves the right to:
  - i. Amend or refuse entry to an Entrant, such as where the Entrant does not meet these Terms and Conditions or other conditions applicable to the Entrant; and
  - ii. Amend, combine, or cancel a Genre/Section or Eisteddfod, such as where there are insufficient Entrants or due to circumstances outside of the control of the GCE.

### 3. Entry Fees:

- a) Entry fees are advertised in GCE Syllabus and website and must be paid in full at the time of entry. Entrants do not have an entry into the Eisteddfod until the entry fee is paid and Entrants have received email confirmation of their entry and payment.
- b) Entry fees are not refundable except when a category or section is cancelled by the GCE after the Entrant has entered the Eisteddfod or in other circumstances as determined by the GCE (such as where Entrants may be eligible for a refund by law).

### 4. Eisteddfod Events:

- a) All genres' sections available for entry in the current Eisteddfod year are specified in Syllabus.
- b) Performance Guidelines for each Genre section are specified in the Syllabus. Entrants must comply with the Performance Guidelines.
- 5. Communication and privacy:
  - a) Entrants agree to receive electronic messages and marketing communications from the GCE about the Eisteddfod. If Entrants do not want to receive marketing communications from GCE, Entrants can unsubscribe by contacting GCE on contact details below.

GCE collects and handles Entrants' personal information in the course of operating the Eisteddfod, and in order to provide the Entrant with an entry into the Eisteddfod. GCE will keep this personal information safe and secure. Entrants can contact the GCE on the contact details below for any questions regarding the collection and handling of personal information.

### 6. Conduct:

- a) Entrants must conduct themselves in a professional, respectful and sportsmanlike manner throughout the Eisteddfod.
- b) GCE may take steps against Entrants who do not exhibit the expected behaviour, including actions such as prohibiting Entrants from participating in the Eisteddfod and future Eisteddfods.

### 7. Liability:

a) GCE's public liability does not comprehensively cover injury to performers. Individuals and groups are responsible for their own safety, and obtaining comprehensive insurance to cover all performers, and other attendees while performing and/or attending the Eisteddfod. The GCE is not responsible for any injury, loss, or damage during the Eisteddfod.

### 8. Images & Footage:

- a) GCE reserves the right to record, film and photograph ('Content') at the Eisteddfod. Entrants grant permission for GCE to obtain this Content and use such Content for promotional or marketing purposes and on social media. Entrants will not receive any remuneration or compensation for their participation in promotional or marketing activity. Entrants can advise GCE if they do not wish to be recorded, filmed, or photographed by advising GCE via the contact details below.
- b) Entrants or audience members may be prohibited from recording, filming, or photography Entrants during some performances or at some venues. Entrants and audience members must comply with GCE's prohibitions on recording, filming or photographing when advised.
- c) GCE is not liable for any copyright infringement by Entrants or others relating to the use of music or Content.

### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- 1. Unless otherwise stated, the Gold Coast Eisteddfod is for amateur performers only i.e. any person who does not derive nor has ever derived his or her main income or a substantial income as a teacher and/or performer in the particular category of performing arts for which he/she wishes to enter.
- 2. **Entries close: April 22, 2025, unless sold out prior.** Please submit entries as early as possible online. Payment will be by card via PayPal or direct debit.
- 3. Enter online at www.goldcoasteisteddfod.com.au. No late entries. For assistance in entering please view\_https://www.goldcoasteisteddfod.com.au/entry-instructions/
- 4. It is the responsibility of the entrants, teacher, parent or carer to list the correct section numbers on entry. GCE accepts no responsibility for incorrect entries received.
- 5. Entry fees are not refundable unless the section is cancelled by GCE.
- 6. Unless otherwise stated, no performance can be repeated within the genre.
- 7. Time limits must be observed. These are the maximum an item may be shorter than the limit but not exceed it. Should time limits be exceeded, the adjudicator will penalise.
- 8. GCE reserves the right to cancel, combine or split any section/s.
- 9. GCE reserves the right to appoint a new adjudicator should it be deemed necessary.
- 10. The decision of the adjudicator is final.
- 11. Prompting, except by an adjudicator is not permitted.
- 12. Intending performers who have been pupils of an adjudicator within six months prior to GCE start date will be ineligible to enter any section judged by the adjudicator. (Workshops/Guest Teachers excluded)
- 13. Photo & Video
  - Mobile phones must be switched off in backstage and change room areas at all venues. No cameras allowed in these areas.
  - Where there is no official operator, private recording is permitted only by the parent/representative or teacher of the performer on stage. No photography during a performance.

- 14. Any item having to withdraw after entering, must notify GCE as soon as possible to ensure smooth programming.
- 15. Performers must be present at the beginning of the session as withdrawals may alter the order of appearance. Due to this, it is unwise to anticipate exact performance times.
- 16. Any protest or objection must be referred to the Convenor of the genre within 30 minutes of the Adjudicator's decision. A protest will only be accepted from a performer, the performer's teacher or parent and must be received in writing with a \$50 fee. If the complaint is found to be valid, this fee will be refunded. In the case of a dispute arising in respect of the age of any competitor and their eligibility to appear in any age grouping, GCE reserves the right to request a copy of the birth certificate of that competitor. Anonymous letters will NOT be considered.
- 17. Every care will be taken for performers' safety, but GCE will not be responsible for any injuries sustained by any competitor and or damage to property during GCE.
- 18. Teachers please note there will be no additions to the program unless the omission is the fault of GCE.
- 19. GCE has the right to amend the program at any time.
- 20. Performers and/or winners' names and/or photographs may be used in the media. Should this not be appropriate the Eisteddfod office MUST BE notified in writing prior.
- 21. Failure to comply with any of the rules and regulations may result in penalisation or withholding of prizes. The decision of GCE on any question or dispute shall be absolutely final.
- 22. All medals & trophies are provided by the Gold Coast Eisteddfod.
- 23. All teachers and accompanists must either collect an identifying pass or wear a school badge.

### SMALL ENSEMBLES & ROCK BAND SPECIFIC

- E01. A copy of sheet music must be uploaded via our system. https://www.goldcoasteisteddfod.com.au/performance-uploads/
- E02. Time limit is calculated from first note played to the last note played including applause between items. At the time limit stated, up to 15 seconds may be allowed to conclude the performance. It is NOT essential to play up to the time limit. Penalties will be applied by the adjudicator if the performance is over the stated time limit.
- E03. To avoid program clashes a conductor must be nominated on entry together with numbers in each ensemble.
- E04. Students must attend the school they represent (unless otherwise stated).
- E05. Directors of groups must arrange for responsible adults with school ID to supervise members inside and outside the theatre.
- E06. Banners will be permitted for front row players only.
- E07. On stage preparation time must not exceed 4 minutes including set up and tuning.
- E08. All electrical requirements, including keyboard, amplifiers and power supplies, need to comply with Queensland Government regulations i.e. must have current electrical test and tag. Non-compliance will result in the equipment being disallowed.
- E09. Directors of groups must arrange for responsible adults with school ID to supervise members inside and outside the theatre.
- E10. Performers must be in their allocated instrument storage /tuning room or allocated seating in the theatre prior to start time of their sections. Performers must stay together as a group for the duration of the session and are not permitted to join parents in the audience seating.

- E11. Instruments or belongings are not be left unattended except in allocated storage areas.
- E12. Teachers please note withdrawals and events beyond the control of the convenor may affect the running time of sections. All reasonable effort will be made to adhere to the program but the order of appearance may be changed without advance notice at the discretion of the convenor. Please advise parents only the section start time not anticipated performance time.
- E13. There may be some changes in dates and venues so please carefully check program when received. Ensure program links are refreshed to receive the current information.

### All sheet music is to be uploaded via GCE system. Rock Bands to advise set up prior to event.

### **AWARDS**

The Adjudicator will award First, Second & Third places along with allocating each performance a rating of Platinum, Gold, Silver or Bronze (this will be marked on adjudication paper).

The rating will be marked on the following performance aspects evaluated:

- Musicianship a responsiveness to style, expressiveness, the artistic rendering of the composer's intention and sense of ensemble.
- Technique addressing all technical demands in the score including intonation, production, accuracy, and the evident skill level of the performers.
- Presentation this addresses the performers demeanour, the appropriate selection of repertoire, and an adherence to GCE requirements.

PLATINUM - 96-100% GOLD - 81-95% SILVER - 61-80% BRONZE - 45-60% Participation - up to 45%

All primary school performers will receive a Participation Certificate.
